




Decorating







Eleanor has challenged Rachel to deck out her one-acre garden with decorations, by first noting their measurements and making sure everything fits in the right place.

The garden is formed by the 3 similar square grid plots found on the following pages. Place each of the given decorations (shown in this page and the next) exactly once into the correct grid, following standard Statue Park puzzle rules, namely:


- Decorations may be rotated or reflected when placed.
- Decorations cannot overlap or be orthogonally adjacent in each grid.
- All remaining spaces not occupied by decorations must form one orthogonally connected area in each grid.
- Black circles in a grid represent spaces that must be occupied by a decoration, and white circles represent spaces that may not be occupied by a decoration.






